"Two Wolves - A Continuous Fight Within"



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Building on the legacy of Mira Nair's *Salaam Bombay*, Salaam Baalak Trust (SBT) began in the 1980s. Over the years, starting with *Jivan Ki Gaadi* in 1990 - theatre has been a therapeutic tool for street children and has continued to empower young voices through annual performances.

This year's play, *Two Wolves*, was the gripping story of Ajju and Sunny, two young boys battling inner demons. Ajju, 17, is ensnared in crime, while 14-year-old Sunny seeks revenge, both are unaware of the consequences that their actions could lead to. The play explores themes of parental neglect, societal responsibility, and redemption, reflecting the challenges faced by many of the children who come to us.

Two Wolves is a powerful reminder of the need for guidance and support in shaping brighter futures for vulnerable children.

Dussehra: Children Bring Ravan to Life







Artreach Workshop: Enhancing Learning Through Play



"Empowering Digital Literacy: Part 2 of the Basic Computer and MS Word Workshop"




