
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National Kickboxing Championship wins!


CELEBRATION

After a decade of unwavering dedication, Olive transitioned to being a teacher at the Drop-in Centre, where she played a vital role in nurturing and educating children. In 2010, the Drop-in Centre relocated to the DMRC Children Home, and Olive continued her meaningful work there, also managing the responsibilities of accounting and stationery.

In 2011, she took on the role of coordinator at Aarushi Home, and by 2013, she broadened her impact further by becoming the coordinator at the Akanksha Centre in Pratap Nagar, a community-based program dedicated to supporting local children and families.

Olive's journey continued at the Pragati Centre in Mansarovar, where she has been a driving force since joining in August 2019.

With an extraordinary 25 years of service characterized by dedication, compassion, and excellence, Olive has profoundly impacted the lives of countless children and families.
