Nearly 100 adults and children received eye check-ups and valuable guidance on maintaining good eye health. We are grateful to all partners for making this impactful health initiative possible.


Inspiring Future Leaders: UPSC Orientation Session by Trustee Ashok Sir at DMRC Children's Home
